<p>Art History: Balloon Dog</p> <p>Modern Artist: Jeff Koons</p> <p>Jeff Koons - Born in York, Pennsylvania on January 21, 1955 His father was a furniture dealer and interior decorator. His mother was a seamstress. When he was nine years old, his father would place old master paintings that Koons copied and signed in the window of his shop in an attempt to attract visitors. Education: School of the Art Institute of Chicago Maryland Institute College of Art, Baltimore</p>	<p>Balloon Series Fun Facts:</p> <p>Size: 10 feet x 12 feet x 4 feet Inspiration: Son's 3-year old birthday party Animals: Rabbit, Monkey, Swan, & Dog Auction: November 12, 2013, Balloon Dog (Orange) sold for \$58.4 million, making the sculpture the most expensive by a living artist. 2019, sold his stainless steel Rabbit for \$91.1 million, beating his record.</p>

<p>Artwork Outline:</p> <p>Google Slide: What could be the name of this art? Made from mirror-polished stainless steel and painted over with a coating of translucent paint</p> <p>Project Outline:</p> <p>Sign your name in the corner like an artist</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Choose 3 crayons a light, medium, and dark color 2. Use the LIGHT color to add curve lines 3. Use the MEDIUM color to first - OUTLINE second - COLOR in the ovals 4. Use the DARK color to add a curved line (opposite of the highlight) for a shadow 5. Add swirls, lines, and/or dots to the yellow frame. <p>All Done? Flip your paper over...</p> <p>You try to draw a Balloon Dog on the back.</p> <p>Start with an oval tummy Add four ovals - like a flower Add a curved line for each leg to make another leg Add a small curved oval for the tail Add an ear and head with a triangle for the nose</p>	 <p>Artwork inspired by Balloon Dog by Jeff Koons Name: <u>Mary</u></p>
